Effects of domestic violence on children. Many children exposed to violence in the home are also victims of physical abuse. 1 Children who witness domestic violence or are victims of abuse themselves are at serious risk for long-term physical and mental health problems. 2 Children who witness violence between parents may also be at greater risk of being violent in their future relationships. If you are a parent who is experiencing abuse, it can be difficult to know how to protect your child.

As many as ten million children and adolescents witness violence between their parents or caregivers each year. This kind of violence is called domestic violence or intimate partner violence. The US Department of Justice defines domestic violence as "a pattern of abusive behavior in any relationship that is used by one partner to gain or maintain power and control over another intimate partner."

Domestic Violence and Children

Researchers have estimated that between 3.3 million and 10 million children are exposed to adult domestic violence each year. One researcher has estimated conservatively that at least 10 to 20 percent of children are exposed to intimate partner violence annually, with as many as one-third exposed at some point during childhood or adolescence.

Rates of Child Abuse and Child Exposure to Domestic Violence

Recommended public health approaches to the treatment of children exposed to violence include specific training for professionals working with families experiencing trauma, developmentally appropriate interventions for children in programs addressing domestic violence, and programs that address the emotional needs of children living under circumstances where they are likely to experience violence (e.g., poverty, domestic violence, substance abuse, neighborhood violence).

Children's Exposure to Violence - Child Trends

Signs that a child has witnessed domestic abuse can include: aggression or bullying, anti-social behaviour, like vandalism, anxiety, depression or suicidal thoughts, attention seeking, bed-wetting, nightmares or insomnia, constant or regular sickness, like colds, headaches and mouth ulcers, drug or alcohol use.

But what you may not realise is that children also experience domestic violence and this affects their physical and emotional health and wellbeing. 1 in 4 children are exposed to domestic violence.

The effects of domestic violence on children and young ...

One in seven (14.2%) children and young people under the age of 18 will have lived with domestic violence at some point in their childhood. 61.7% of women in refuge on the Day to Count 2017 had children (aged under 18) with them (Women's Aid, 2018 - data from Women's Aid Annual Survey 2017).

Several studies also reveal that children who witness domestic violence are more likely to be affected by violence as adults - either as victims or perpetrators.5 Children who are exposed to violence in the home are denied their right to a safe and stable home environment. Many are suffering silently, and with little support.

Children exposed to domestic violence are likely to develop behavioral problems, such as regressing, exhibiting out of control behavior, and imitating behaviors. Children may think that violence is an acceptable behavior of intimate relationships and become either the victim or the abuser.

Responding to children exposed to domestic and family violence should occur alongside primary prevention. Primary prevention should be universally delivered, should help children to become critical of gender norms and violence-supportive attitudes, and equip them with the skills to form healthy and respectful relationships in adulthood.

In one study that included observations of group play and assessment of children's relationships with their preschool teachers, children exposed to domestic violence were more likely to exhibit negative affect, respond less appropriately to situations, be more aggressive with peers, and have more ambivalent relationships with their caregivers. 94 The most significant predictors of children's adjustment were psychological violence against the mother and the mother's self-esteem.

Children and youth who are exposed to domestic violence experience emotional, mental, and social damage that can affect their developmental growth. Some children lose the ability to feel empathy for others. Others feel socially isolated, unable to make friends as easily due to social discomfort or confusion over what is acceptable.

Radford et al., (2011), in a study of child maltreatment in the UK, found that 14.2 per cent of children were exposed to domestic violence before the age of eighteen. This has led to marked increases in referrals to social work agencies in cases in which children have been exposed to domestic violence.
